

Instruction



Utah has developed a Core Curriculum which outlines standards of learning that are essential for all students at each elementary grade level. McGraw-Hill Reading Wonders will be at the foundation of our literacy instruction. Wonders will have students reading, thinking, and writing about an essential question each week. Wonders has an online component that students can assess from home.

During our literacy block students will participate in whole group instruction, followed by small groups and independent work. Students will self assess their ability to be a quality worker and producer.

Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Math Expressions will be our math book this year. With close assessment, Mrs. Heidi will be able to give students opportunities to extend their thinking or to strengthen their math foundation. Students will be encouraged to share their mathematical thinking through speaking and writing.

We will join teams on the Amazing Race they travel around the world. Families are encouraged to watch the show at home. Students will not be penalized or at a disadvantage if they don't. Watching the show is a fun way to connect to our Social Studies curriculum and see faraway places in an exciting format. In class we will do activities inspired by the show but connected to our core.

Students will have many hands—on science experiences this year. Students will keep an interactive journal. Our science will extend into writing.

Requirements

Mrs. Heidi needs your help to provide the best possible third grade experience for your child. Please:

- Make sure that students are at school every day that they are in good health.
- Help your child to be at school on time. The doors open at 8:25 and students need to be in their seats ready to learn when the bell rings at 8:30.
- Ensure that your child is well rested and not hungry.
- Support your child in completing and returning their homework packet. Students will be given a homework packet on Monday. On the front of the sheet is a planner aiding them in knowing what to complete each day.
- Encourage your child to read 20 or more minutes each night. Sign the reading calendar and turn it in on the first day of each month.
- Mrs. Heidi will provide the supplies needed in the classroom. Please make sure your child brings a
 backpack to carry their home folder in.
- Contact Mrs. Boogert when you have questions or concerns. Together we make a team working for your child's best education.

Behavior Plan

The rules in our classroom are:

1. Follow directions the first time given.

2. Keep hands, feet, and objects, to yourself.

Grading




